Discharge & Final Statement for African American Soldier on the Western Frontier

Recruited by the Army after the Civil War, four regiments of African Americans served in the Western Frontier, building forts, hunting outlaws, protecting railroad workers and fighting Indians. The Indians called these men from the 24th and 25th Infantry, and the 9th and 10th Calvary, "Buffalo Soldiers" because their curly hair resembled that of the buffalo.

Discharge papers for Private Abram Day of the 24th Regiment, dated May 13, 1875, settle amounts due to the soldier and to the United States. This document, known as the "Final Statement," gives personal information about Private Day, including appearance, place of birth (Galatin, Tennessee) and prior occupation (farmer) along with a reiteration of the amount of pay due upon discharge. Private Day was discharged "...by reason of Expiration of time of service."

Note 11.—Amounts due the laundress must be entered on the muster-roll on which the discharge, death, describen, &c., is reported as well as on the final statements, otherwise, the amount cannot be collected from the United States.

MOTE 12.—When a soldier DIES in hospital or on datached service, his descriptive list, if he has one, should be sent with his final statements, in deplicate, to the Adjutant General, Washington, D. C., and his Company Commander not field of his death, giving date, cause, &c., the disposition of his effects, and the state of his accounts.

NOTE 13.—To prevent payments on freudulent discharge papers, paymenters are directed to refuse payment unless the identity of the soldier is properly established.

As discharged soldiers usually travel in advance of the mail, company constrainders, adjutants commanding regimental bands and non-commissioned staff, and medical officers in charge of hospitals, will send to the chief paymaster the notification of discharge required several mails previous to date of discharge. These commanders will send with this notification the signature of the discharged soldier as additional proof of identity, if he can write his name; if he cannot write his name, this fact will be reported in writing on the notification of discharge. If the soldier prefers payment elsewhere, the notification will be sent to the paymaster to whom the discharged soldier will present himself. If not sent by mail, the notification must be sent through another channel than the hands of the man discharged. No payments will be made on discharge papers by any paymaster except spon receipt of such notification, unless he may be otherwise satisfied of their genuireness, and of the personal identity of the claimant. G. O. No. 8, A. G. O. of 1872.

Note 14.—If henceably discharged by special order from A. G. Office, before the expiration of his term of service, the soldier will be entitled to travel pay, unless said order sets forth that be forfeits travel pay.

In the latter case the Company Commander will note on the final statement the forfeiture of travel pay.

NOTE 15.—This blank will be used for deceased soldiers, as well as for others.
